New Business: Gale, transparent languages -- this will be the last year for this program as it is not being used Brain Fuse and A - Z are new programs. Brain Fuse is up and running and very successful. Cost is less than anticipated and is through the state library. A - Z is an interactive learning tool and will cost \$180. Funds for both of these programs will be reallocated from grant money intended for a summer reading program that was not put in place due to COVID.

Opening Library: The board is well pleased with how Adair county is handling the COVID situation and wish to open the library as soon as it is safe to do so. This will depend on how things go for the next few weeks. So far patrons are not eager to make appointments. Staff will continue with the very successful order pick-up program, a soft opening will proceed carefully, bathrooms will not be opened, limited time allowed for patrons in the building, computers limited to 30 minutes, hand sanitizer available, masks requested.

Policies: Anna is drafting a new crisis response policy. State issued guidelines are being used and the policy will be broad enough to cover almost any situation that might affect the library. The policy will be sent to the board for review.
